

Olive Annette Davidson the daughter of Olaf and Anna Dilland, was born August 30, 1911 on her parent's homestead south of Tioga, in West Bank Township, Williams County, ND. Olive attended the Wolla School, a one-room country school. At age 12, she lived with her Aunt Hannah and Uncle Herman in Faribault, MN, graduating from high school in 1929. After a year of teacher training, Olive moved back to the Tioga – Williston area.

Olive married Orville Davidson, and they started raising a family. The Davidson's began farming at the beginning of the Depression and survived its many hardships. In January, 1945, the Davidson family moved to Oregon and worked in a plywood factory. In 1948, they bought a farm near Lakota, North Dakota. There were lean years on the Davidson farm again, with wheat stem rust or lack of rain ruining their last four crops. In 1954, they moved back to Williams County, eventually taking over operation of the homestead of Orville's father, Halvor Davidson. Orville was forced to retire due to a disability in 1961, moved his family to Missoula, Montana. Olive restarted her education at the University of Montana, graduating with honors in library science in 1965. Then she earned her Master's Degree in Library Science at the University of Illinois in 1967. After graduate school, she became a reference librarian and cataloguer at the U of I and worked until retiring in 1977. Olive returned to North Dakota after retiring and lived in Ray and Williston until 2011. In 2011, she moved to the Touchmark Assisted Living Community in Bismarck, North Dakota.

Olive's husband of 30 years, Orville Davidson, died in 1963. Two daughters, Marjory Davidson Hauge of Ray, ND and Joan Davidson Smith of Mountain Home, AR, preceded her in death. She is survived by two sons and a daughter, Jerry Davidson of Lakewood, CO, James Davidson of Alexandria, VA, and Lynn Davidson Chase of Las Vegas, NV; six grandchildren, eleven great-grandchildren, and fourteen great great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Davidson was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church.
