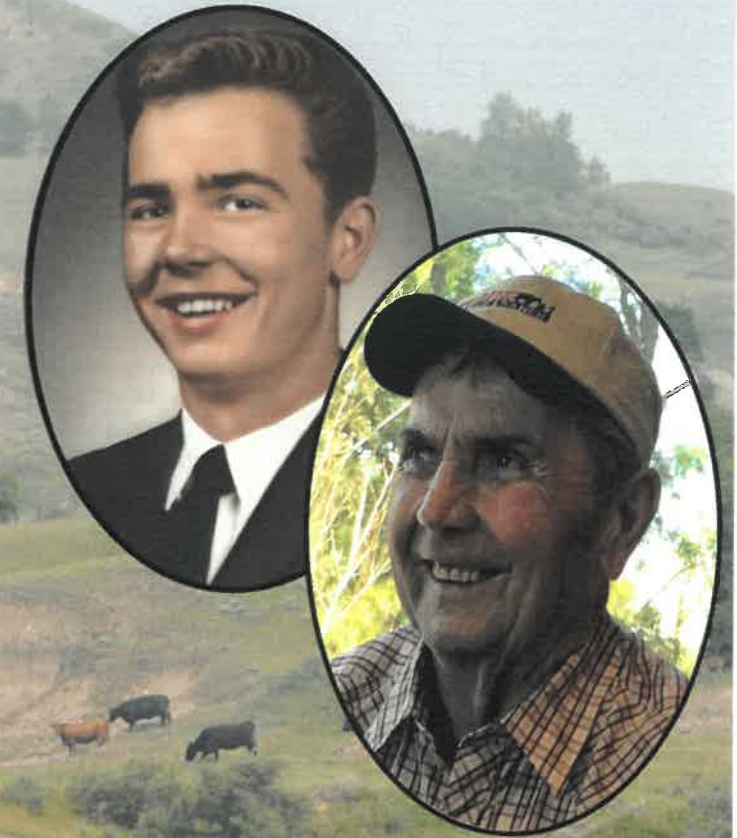

Leon Clifford Enget was born July 25, 1942 to Clifford & Theodora Signe (Ostby) Enget in Powers ND. He grew up on the family farm southwest of Powers Lake where they raised cattle, horses, and small grains. Leon attended country school until the 8th grade and then Powers Lake High

School where he graduated in 1960. He would always make sure to talk about how they were unbeaten in football

After graduation, Leon attended Molar Barber College in Fargo, ND. He worked as a barber in Dickinson and then Crosby, ND, where he met the love of his life, Elouise Mae Holm. Leon and Elouise were married on September 19, 1964. They moved to Powers Lake where they raised their family, owned and operated Le-Els Barber and Beauty Shop, farmed, and raised cattle and horses. Leon was proud to have served in the ND National Guard for 6 years. He was employed at Amerada Hess for many years and barbered in Lignite until retirement.



Leon was very involved in his children's and grandchildren's lives and activities. He enjoyed watching them all play sports, compete in horse shows and rodeos, or just spending time with them on his farm. Leon loved all children and would entertain them by wiggling his ears, which would sometimes cause a ruckus in church. He enjoyed woodworking and built many items for his family. Leon was an active member of Bethel Baptist Church, Jaycees, Lakeside Arena Corp, Powers Lake Saddle Club, and White Earth Valley Saddle Club. In his younger years, he and his brother, Allie, trained many horses. He also enjoyed team roping with his good friends, especially his roping partner Bob "Swede" Blomquist. He had a great sense of humor and loved playing practical jokes on friends and family. Leon passed away at Trinity Hospital on June 1, 2018, surrounded by family, after suffering a stroke.
