


I'm Free Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free I'm following the path God has laid you see. I took His hand when I heard Him call I turned my back and left it all.

Cleo peacefully departed this world to meet her Lord on Saturday, October 6, 2018, with her Extended Care Family, her brother Burdett, his wife Fay and niece Stephanie by her side.
