Irene Hilda (Hanson) Moore was born in December 14, 1915 in Sisseton, SD to Inga and Hans Hanson Jr. Irene graduated from Montevideo High School, MN in 1933. During high school she worked at Smiths Creamery and helped with home and child care for friends and family. She married Mark Moore in Groton CT August 28 1938, while Mark was in the Navy. Their 1st son, Gary, was born in 1939. They then moved to Sonoma, CA, where Mark owned a mechanic's shop. They then had their 2nd son, Ron, in 1943. Irene taught preschool and kindergarten class for 2 years at their church. They moved to MT in 1950 and operated Moore Dairy and Culbertson Cold Control until Marks passing in 1980.
