Roy was an extremely hard worker. He loved the fall and hunting from the time he was a young boy until his death. He loved to golf in the spring and summer, a hobby he first picked up in the 60's playing on sand greens. He was known to play twice a day and be the first one out in the spring and the last one to play the course in the fall. He loved his yard and flowers. In the winter he played pinochle and cheered for the Minnesota Vikings.

Roy was a loving and devoted father. His family was his main focus and the reason for his many years of hard work. He had unconditional love for his children and that never wavered in times of trouble. Words cannot possibly express how much we will miss him.

Roy died Thursday evening, July 19, 2007 at Mercy Hospital in Williston, surrounded by his loving family.


