

Jim served aboard the U.S.S Buchanan for 4 years and was honorably discharged as an E-5 Boatswain's Mate in 1989. In February of 1986, Jim married the absolute love of his life, Cindy Fuller of Torrance, California. From this union, they brought into this world, two beautiful sons, Josh and Zak.

After the Navy, Jim started his career in construction where he worked for several companies in both Montana and Nevada. His business was a great success as they had the amazing ability to turn an idea into a reality.
