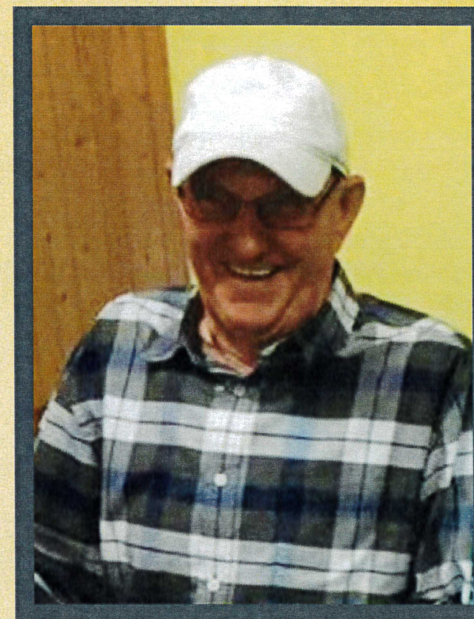

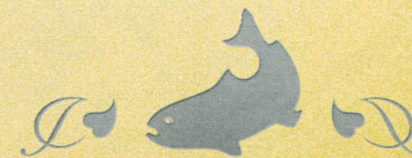

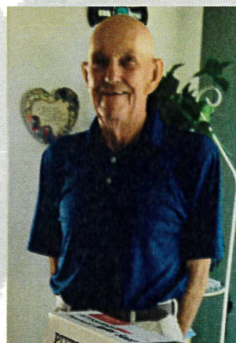
Joseph "Joe" Leroy Grossman, age 86, passed away at home from natural causes, Saturday July 2nd, 2022.

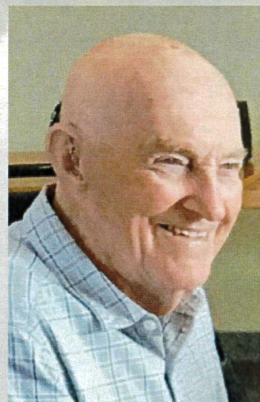
