Pat loved teaching her family members how to sew and was always ready and willing to help with any project, big or small. Her family will forever remember her mantra; "Press and sew, press and sew".





Pat was always baking, most notably her famous buns. She always had fresh baked goods on the counter for family members who stopped by or friends who came for coffee visits. During holidays, Pat made everyone's favorite treats and knew exactly what each person liked. She also enjoyed decorating and redecorating her house, frequently changing out comforters and sewing curtains to match. Everything in her home had its place, and nothing was ever out of order.
